4. Visas and Practical Framework

For temporary "snowbird" stays of up to **90 days**, citizens from the EU, UK, and US receive a free visitor's visa upon arrival. This can be officially extended for an additional 90 days (totaling **180 days**) once inside the country via VFS Global, making it perfect for a non-tax-resident winter escape.

For those looking to move permanently, South Africa offers a dedicated **Retired Person Visa**. It requires demonstrating a passive income of **37,000 ZAR per month** (~€1,850 / \$2,000) from pensions, rental income, or investment dividends, ensuring you can comfortably support your lifestyle under the African sun.
